

Aktual

The process of producing a font family like FT Aktual aimed to obtain a versatile grotesque both capable to perform in big titles as well in small texts, on paper and on screen, contemporary as its name. The first drawings date back to 2020, when we approached the project with Alberto Malossi and we decided to extend the family with 14 styles and a variable-font version too. Some stylistic sets and a wide set of small caps glyphs permits to decline it, giving the details that makes it even more iconic.

The Last Dance is a 2020 American sports documentary miniseries co-produced by ESPN Films and Netflix. Directed by Jason Hehir, the series revolves around the career of Michael Jordan, with particular focus on his final season with the Chicago Bulls. The series features exclusive footage from a film crew that had an all-access pass to the Bulls, as well as interviews of many NBA personalities including Jordan, Scottie Pippen, Dennis Rodman, Steve Kerr, and Phil Jackson.

The series aired on ESPN from April 19 to May 17, 2020, in the United States, while its episodes were released on Netflix internationally the day after their US airings; beginning on May 23, two episodes were aired back-to-back on ESPN's corporate partner ABC. ESPN2 aired an alternate version of the series intended for family viewing, which removed most of the profanity heard in the episodes. It received critical acclaim, with praise for its directing and editing. It won the Primetime Emmy Award for Outstanding Documentary or Non-fiction Series at the 72nd Primetime Emmy Awards.

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
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Etymology

The term “alley-oop” is derived from the French term *allez hop!*, the cry of a circus acrobat about to leap. The term “Alley Oop” was first popularized in the US in 1932 as the name of a syndicated comic strip created by cartoonist V. T. Hamlin. In sports, the term “alley-oop” first appeared in the 1950s by the San Francisco 49ers of the NFL to describe a high arcing pass from quarterback Y. A. Tittle to wide receiver R.C. Owens, who would outleap smaller cornerbacks for touchdown receptions (“The Catch”, the Dwight Clark touchdown reception from Joe Montana by which the 49ers gained entry into their first Super Bowl, was also an “alley-oop” pass) and later became better known from its use in basketball.

ALLEY-OOP (AMERICAN FOOTBALL)

The alley-oop is an American football play in which the quarterback throws the ball high into the air, and another player jumps up and catches it. The play was developed in 1957 by San Francisco 49ers players Y. A. Tittle and R. C. Owens. The play was named after V. T. Hamlin's comic strip character Alley Oop; Owens himself was also known as “Alley Oop”. It was highly successful when utilized due to Owens' 6 ft 3 in height and ability to out-leap defenders.

Tittle said of the play: “With the Alley-Oop now considered to be a legitimate weapon, the only defense against it was a defensive back who could outleap R.C. — and at that time, no such animal existed in the NFL.”

According to the Oxford English Dictionary, the usage of the term in football predates its usage in basketball by two years, with the football counterpart also inspiring the play in basketball.

History

In the 1950s, some players began grabbing balls in mid-air and then dunking. K. C. Jones and Bill Russell teamed up to perform the alley-oop several times while at the University of San Francisco in the mid-1950s.

In addition, Bill Russell, Wilt Chamberlain at the University of Kansas and ‘Jumping’ Johnny Green at Michigan State University would frequently grab errant shots by teammates and dunk them. This resulted in a tightening in the enforcement of offensive goaltending rules in NCAA and NBA basketball in the late 1950s.

The Phillips 66ers of the National Industrial Basketball League had an alley-oop play in its playbook where Charlie Bowerman would pass the ball to Don Kojis. Kojis played two seasons for the 66ers between 1961 and 1963 making that the time period when the play was executed.

Al Tucker and his brother Gerald at Oklahoma Baptist University are sometimes mistakenly credited with being the first to use the alley-oop in the mid-60s. In Bill Walton’s record-setting 44-point, 21-for-22 shooting performance for UCLA in the 1973 NCAA championship game against Memphis State, six of his baskets came on alley-oop plays.

Some others credit David Thompson as the first player to execute the classic alley-oop play while at North Carolina State University, with his teammates Monte Towe and Tim Stoddard performing the necessary lob passes. NCSU’s Thompson popularized the play during the early 1970s, exploiting his 44-inch vertical leap to make the above-the-rim play a recurring staple in the Wolfpack’s offensive attack. Because dunking was illegal in college basketball at that time, upon catching the pass, Thompson would simply drop the ball through the hoop — never dunking one until the final play of the final home game of his career.

After a decade of dunking prohibition ended in the NCAA in 1976, the alley-oop became associated in the late 1970s with Michigan State’s Earvin ‘Magic’ Johnson and Greg Kelser. The duo connected for many highlight alley-oops and would showcase the play in their 1979 national championship run, including the most watched game in the history of the sport, the famed Magic vs. Bird championship game. Three years later, unheralded Idaho made the alley-oop an integral part of their undersized offense in 1982, ended the regular season eighth in both major polls at 26–2, and advanced to the Sweet Sixteen.

The following year, North Carolina State also won the national championship on what could be considered the most famous alley-oop of all time against heavily-favored Houston in the 1983 championship game at The Pit in Albuquerque, New Mexico. With time running out and the score tied, guard Dereck Whittenburg shot short of the rim, which effectively functioned as a pass to Lorenzo Charles, who caught the ball and stuffed it through the net to win the title in a huge upset.

During the 1990s, NBA stars turned the alley-oop into the game’s ultimate quick-strike weapon. In recent years, teams have often run the alley-oop as a planned play. The 2008 National Champions Kansas Jayhawks had several designs for alley-oops, including some thrown from inbound sets, and could execute them interchangeably with almost all of the players being able to both lob and finish the play.

Popular culture

In the 2008 film *Semi-Pro*, protagonist Jackie Moon, played by Will Ferrell, invents the alley-oop after being knocked unconscious and speaking with his deceased mother in a depiction of Heaven. The crowd and announcers are left nearly speechless, unable to comprehend what happened. The referee is dumbfounded and feels the play should be a foul, and maybe even two fouls. Monix, played by Woody Harrelson, breaks down the mechanics of the play and convinces the referee that it’s worth two points. This play allowed the fictional Flint Tropics to rally back and eventually defeat the San Antonio Spurs.

LeBron James, in full LeBron Raymone James, byname King James, (born December 30, 1984, Akron, Ohio, U.S.), American professional basketball player who is widely considered one of the greatest all-around players of all time and who won National Basketball Association (NBA) championships with the Miami Heat (2012 and 2013), the Cleveland Cavaliers (2016), and the Los Angeles Lakers (2020). James was the consensus national high-school player of the year in his senior season, and he was selected by the Cleveland Cavaliers with the first overall selection of the 2003 NBA draft. Additionally, he signed an unprecedented \$90 million endorsement contract with the Nike shoe company before he ever played...

Thanks for having me, Larry.

KING: What was it like to grow up near here in much lesser circumstances than here? Then have this?

JAMES: Well, first of all, this is humbling because I know where I come from and I grew up as a kid 10 minutes away from where I am living today. It was a struggle. But at the end of the day it made me become who I am today.

K Did you ever dream as a kid there, that someday...

J Absolutely. Every day. As a kid, we would drive up and down 77 North — that's our highway — there would be office buildings on the side of the highway and I'd be like, that's what my house is going to look like when I get older. I'm going to start making my house look like this. Sometimes when I look at my house now and it's kind of bigger than some of those office buildings.

K So even though all of that ability, do you pinch yourself?

J I stay humble, absolutely. I mean, this is an opportunity that I don't think I could have dreamed of. But everything that I've gotten over these past two years I've embraced.

K When did you know you had talent? Particular talent?

J When did I know I had talent? I think it started when I first started playing sports, organized sports. I played football for a team called the East Dragons on the east side of town. We only had six regular season games. And six games I played tail back and I had 18 touchdowns in six games. That's when I knew I had some athletic ability.

K How about the first time on a basketball court?

J The first time on a basketball court was later on that year. Football season is always before basketball so I played in my first recreation league, I played for the Summit Lake Hornets, where I grew up playing basketball in 8-10 league. I was nine years old and we won the championship. I was one of the best players on the team back then so it was pretty fun. I was able to win a championship of football and basketball in the same year.

K So your high hopes were warranted? But you had a tough childhood. Your mother's only 16 when you're born. You move a lot, 12 times between the ages of five and eight. What are your memories of those days?

J My memories of those days was — you know, every day that you woke up, you knew it was going to be a struggle. For me, already being part of a single parent household and knowing it was just me and my mom, you'd would wake up times and hope that the next day you'd be able to be alongside your mother because she was out trying to make sure that I was taken care of. But all I cared about was her being home.

K Did other people help raise you? J Absolutely. I think throughout the years I've had coaches, I've had family members. My mom's two brothers, she had a younger brother and an older brother that was around, too, that helped raise me. A lot of my grade school coaches and my high school coaches helped.

K In your book, "Shooting Stars," you said, you were up half the night scared and lonely and worried. Scared about what?

J Where I grew up — I grew up on the north side of Akron, lived in the projects. So those scared and lonely nights — that's every night. You hear a lot of police sirens, you hear a lot of gunfire. Things that you don't want your kids to hear growing up. When you're there and you know your mother's not home, you never know if those police sirens are for her. Or if those gunshots were intended towards her. So those are the nights, almost every night, that would stand up hearing those sounds and hoping and wishing that it wasn't your parent on the other end.

K Didn't know your dad?

J No.

K Never met him?

J Never met him.

K Ever wonder about him?

J No, I don't think so. I don't. I think, you know, for me, to a certain age it really didn't kick in me not having a father because I always seen my mom. So I was like, I thought this is how it was, you know, until I had some friends and I was like, oh, you got a mom and you got a dad? I didn't know that was the rules.

K Did you ask your mom about your dad?

J No, never. Because for me, she was doing everything I could ever dream of. It was

J times where, you know, Christmas would come around and my birthday would come around and I'd think, I'm going to have one or two presents, or I may not get anything because I understand the struggle. And it would be a floor full of stuff, you know, it would be bags full of

J stuff for my birthday. Christmas is December 25 and my birthday was December 30. So I had gifts on both days so there was no reason to even ask, mom, where's my father, where's my dad, because she was doing it all.

K Did you also realize how young she was?

J I didn't. I had no idea. Now that I look on it, when I look back and say, wow, my mom had me at 16, I don't know how she did it. As a kid you don't know. I know that's my mom. She

J may be 25, she may be 30, I don't know. But

J now that I look back on it, I have no idea how she did it.

K Do you have a lot of compassion for her?

J Absolutely. Absolutely. A lot of my drive and what I do is because of her.

K How did you stay away from gangs —

projects from New York, you think gangs and drugs. I didn't stay away from it.

K You didn't?

J Because I lived in it. When I say, I didn't stay away from it, I didn't mean I was associated with gangs or I was associated with drugs. But when you live in the projects and you live in those circumstances there's nothing you can — you can't get away from it. But sports carried me away from being in a gang, or being associated with drugs. Sports was my way out.

K Did you see a lot of prejudice?

J Growing up? No, not really, because growing up you was around African-Americans every day. And there was no prejudice. We all...

K What about white Americans?

J I didn't — I wasn't around white Americans until the ninth grade when I went to high school. There was no prejudice growing up.

K How about then?

J I don't think so. When I went to St. Vincent-St. Mary, which is a Catholic school — (crosstalk)

K Predominant Catholic school?

J Yes, yes. Predominately white. I didn't see any prejudice at all. I think they accepted us for us being students, for being students and athletes and I didn't see any at all.

K Do you think because of the nature of the school?

J I think so. I think the nature of the school is one family. You know, when you're an eighth grader and you're going into circumstances you haven't been part of, you automatically think it may be some prejudice, but it wasn't any.

K Also you once said, I never thought basketball was going to be my future. I just wanted to play because it gets you girls. (LAUGHTER)

J Yes.

K Was that not true?

J That was true. (LAUGHTER)

K You did all right in the female department.

J Growing up I did all right.

K When do you know, I want to play basketball for a living?

J When did I know? I think I started to get a love for the game around the middle school days. You know, we were going to an AAU tournament, me and my best friend, and my high school coach eventually, but he was our AAU coach, Coach Dru Joyce. We'd go on AAU tournaments and they was fun. The competitive nature of the game, winning and losing and dominating one team and things like that is something that just kind of gravitated towards me.

K Do you have a lot of compassion for her?

J Absolutely. Absolutely. A lot of my drive and what I do is because of her.

K How did you stay away from gangs —

projects from New York, you think ic week with this historic guy and this historic place. LeBron James on LARRY KING LIVE. Don't go away. (COMMERCIAL BREAK)

K We're at this beautiful house in suburban Akron. What city are we in, actually?

J Bath. Bath Township.

K Bath Township.

J Yes. Sounds a little bit more elegant. (LAUGHTER)

K Little impressive. How big a house?

J How big a house? Pretty big. I'm not sure. I just built it and built it and built it.

K You've made it when you don't know how big your house is.

J No, I didn't. It wasn't affordable to go to a Cavs game. If you could catch a few on the TV, you'd be lucky.

AGO BULLS, Michael Jordan fan growing up.

K So the president's suggestion might carry weight, right? (LAUGHTER)

J It may, it may carry weight.

K So why the Bulls and not your own team?

J I was just, wow, I mean, Michael Jordan was just my inspiration. I mean, the things that he was able to do out on the basketball court, I loved. Everybody wanted to fly like Jordan, pull up and hit a game winner at the sound of the horn like Michael. You wanted to do commercials, you wanted to have his shoes.

K You know, everything that he did, I wanted to do.

K When did you first meet him?

J I met Michael Jordan, my first time, I was in the 10th grade. I went to Chicago and they played at a gym called Hoops. That was the first time I met him. It was like he was walking on water when he came towards me.

K What about the kids? You have two children.

J Right.

K Did he know who you were?

J First of all, I think, you know, I love my kids. My girlfriend, she's great. But I think when you think of marriage you understand

J Coach Dru Joyce was a lot. Not just because of what he helped me out with basketball but he was like a father figure on me growing up and understanding that there's more than just the game of basketball. Even though you're playing the game of basketball and even though I'm coaching in the game of basketball, we're going to use this game to create other things. Sometimes you didn't understand exactly what he was saying, you know when you're 12, or 13, or 14. But now, at 25, I understand exactly what he was doing.

K Does she press you?

J No. She doesn't pressure me.

K How do you deal with, frankly, LeBron, and we must be frank, the temptations of life?

J By understanding that when I wake up everyday and I go out in public everyday, I'm not just representing LeBron James, Sr. I understand that my last name is a responsibility for my two boys, my family, my mother, rest in peace, my grandmother, a lot of people. That's what keeps me humble and that's what keeps me away from temptation because I understand that it's not always and it's not just about LeBron James.

K It's always around you, isn't it?

J Absolutely. Temptation is around everybody.

J It's not even always girls, though. It could be girls, it could be other situations, it could be money. Certain money is not always good money. It could be just being at the wrong place at the wrong time. I mean, if you have your priorities in check then for the most part it's easy.

K People are always after you for something. Are you weary?

J Am I weary? I think — of course. There are always people always asking you for something. But I feel like I have a foundation, I have a supporting cast where it doesn't bother me too much. Now in the position I'm in, I understand, I could see people who's here from me and people who's here for the intangibles or the things like that.

K So you know?

J I have a good feeling. I learned that from my mom. I'm a good judge of character.

K We have not forgotten. There is, of course, the obvious, where is he going to go? How does he deal with something like that, this ripe, still young man? What's next? Don't go away. (COMMERCIAL BREAK)

K Before we get to some future things, they played last night so we don't know who won the first game, but who do you like in this Lakers/Celtics series?

J I mean, me being an Eastern Conference guy, I like Boston. I mean, I played against those guys and lost to them in the second round. Just the caliber of players they've got, the winner that they've got, I think they have a great opportunity to win.

Kevin Durant was a high school basketball star and after playing college ball for only one season at the University of Texas, he was chosen second overall in the 2007 NBA draft by the Seattle SuperSonics. Durant went on to become a four-time scoring champion for the organization, which became the Oklahoma City Thunder after his Rookie of the Year campaign, and in 2014 he was voted the league's Most Valuable Player. Durant went on to lead the Golden State Warriors to back-to-back NBA championships, before signing with the Brooklyn Nets in the summer of 2019. Durant received offers from top Division I colleges, and although prompted by his friend, point guard Tywon Lawson, to join him and play for the University of North Carolina Tar Heels, Durant signed with the University of Texas Longhorns in Austin. Russell Springman, a Longhorn assistant and Maryland native, had been in touch with Durant since his freshman year of high school. As a Longhorn, Durant started every game during his freshman year of college, averaging 25.8 points per game (first in the Big 12, fourth in the nation) and 11 rebounds per game in 35 games.
